Dear Loyal Client,

We would like to send our gratitude for all your patience during this difficult time for us without our H-2B workers. While this year has not gone as planned or expected, your continued dedication to The Greenwood Group is greatly appreciated and we will continue to provide your property with the best service possible to continue to maintain and improve your landscapes.

On May 25th, Secretary of Homeland Security Kirstjen M. Nielsen announced that an additional 15,000 H-2B temporary nonagricultural worker visas will be available for Fiscal Year 2018. In this determination, Secretary Nielsen determined there are not sufficient, qualified, U.S. workers available to perform temporary non-agriculture labor to satisfy the needs of American businesses in FY18. This allocation is in addition to the 66,000 visas already issued this year. Secretary Nielsen made this decision after consulting with Secretary of Labor Alexander Acosta, members of Congress, and business owners.

In the first five business days of filing, USCIS received petitions for more beneficiaries than the number of H-2B visas available under the FY 2018 supplemental cap. Accordingly, USCIS is required by regulation to use a computer-generated process, commonly known as a lottery, to randomly select the number of petitions required to meet the increased cap for FY 2018. The lottery included all H-2B cap-subject petitions received between May 31, 2018 and June 6, 2018.

The Greenwood Group once again applied for the additional visas and during the lottery, our petition was selected. Our men will be here and ready to take back over the routes starting the week of July 16th. We are excited and ready to have our long time employees back and continue to provide the great service you've come to know and expect. We will be in touch over the upcoming weeks to provide details on all updated schedules.


