She is another resident in HHR that bought and sold antiques. She still has a house full of items since her mother and grandmother were also antique collectors. Dianne's first love, however, was jewelry designing.

Diane was born and raised in the St. Louis area and graduated from Clayton HS. When she was 19 she and her parents went to California where she was able to dine at the Copa Cabanna and meet several Hollywood stars, including Carmen Miranda. It helped to have parents with contacts. It was on the way home that she bought a silver and sapphire ring. The contemporary modern style inspired her love for designing. She found that she could take jewelry designing at night at Wash. U. A jeweler in St. Louis needed a designer and contacted her teacher. Diane was recommended and hired. She designed jewelry for 2 years. Love conquers all and sometimes changes a life direction. This was Diane's life change. She married her Navy boyfriend and moved away. They did return to Mo. and lived for a while in Creve Coeur. They had four girls and soon moved to Labadie, Mo where they bought a farm. They were not farmers but had a huge house and barn. Diane said her furniture looked like doll furniture so she started replacing it with large antiques. This led to turning the second story of the barn into a shop. In 1980, with a marriage falling apart, she moved to Colorado. With a long time friend; she opened an antique shop in Breckenridge.
