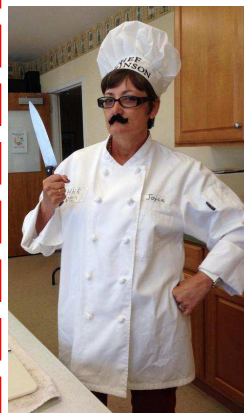

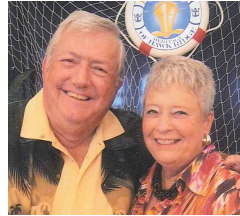

They have helped in changing neighborhoods into communities and Sally and Perry know the difference between the two. They have been true community builders. They have had a golden life, but not without health concerns.

Both Sally and Perry are both two time cancer survivors. They admit to being both lucky and blessed. They say the most lasting memory of their ordeal is the care and support of their many new friends and neighbors in HHR. Perry says that moving to HHR was the best of their many moves.

Perry loves the distinction of being a "Texas Aggie". His bachelor's degree is from Texas A & M; he completed his graduate studies at the University of Houston. Perry served in the Marine Corps for two years. In his profession as a Construction Manager, his company transferred him all over the US with frequent moves - some every two years. He managed projects ranging from high rise office buildings, hospitals, sports arenas, nuclear power plants, pharmaceutical plants, semi conductor plants and just about everything in between. His last major appointment was to the Pentagon where Perry managed the construction of all of the new command and support centers within the Pentagon. These projects were Design/ Built Performance Contracts and all were finished well under budget and well ahead of schedule. The complexity of the Pentagon was part of the lure of the assignment.

Sally went to school at Stephen's College in Columbia, MO. Her baccalaureate degree in education is from University of Houston. Right away Sally named her most important hobby as "Shopping", next was travel, golf, and card games. She loves to read, naming historical fiction and biographies as her favorites. She has been active in the American Cancer Society in both teaching and patient support roles. She is proudest of the teaching she did for US Supreme Court employees. With moves every two years she had little chance of establishing a teaching career and obtaining tenure so she focused on volunteer activities and substitute teaching.

Perry's reading favorites include action, science fiction and civil war histories. Golf, woodworking, and target shooting (Sally can also shoot) are also hobbies.

Sally and Perry have children and grandchildren living in Ft. Wayne, Indiana; Lake St Louis; and Austin, Texas. Their occupations range from construction management, teaching special needs kids, law enforcement and hospital management. They also have a grandson in the United States Air Force. All are doing well and their parents and grandparents are very proud.
