Winter projects are complete on the golf course. These include rebuilt sand bunkers on holes #1, #4 and #9 and improved drainage along the golf cart path in 5 locations to eliminate standing water. We have signed a contract to have larger, commercial grade gutters and downspouts replaced on the clubhouse later this spring. We are also having a community Reserve Study completed to help us evaluate, plan for and budget for improvements to our community amenities. This will serve as a guide for future financial goals. We are required to conduct a formal survey every 2 years to verify the 55 plus age occupancy of the community to ensure compliance with the 80% HOPA (Housing for Older Persons Act) requirement. If we do not have a copy of your driver's license on file for age verification, you will be receiving a form in the mail and a request to bring a copy of your license to the HHR clubhouse. I would greatly appreciate your prompt response so we can keep our files updated and in compliance. — Kelly

ADVISORY BOARD REPORT

February 18, 2020

Those in attendance at the meeting were: Kelly Cobelens, Linda Bird, Larian Johnson, Fred McGavran & John Shaal.

We met briefly with David Kranz from Lawn Authority to discuss our snow removal and any improvements that he might suggest.

The January financial report was reviewed and approved to be posted on the HHRlifestyle website.

The January golf financials were reviewed. The golf financials (simple income vs. expense figures) will now be posted each month below the financials on the website.

The acoustic panels were completed in the ballroom on January 30th.

Greenwood will have their seasonal workers April 1st. Spring lawn service should not be affected.

The golf course projects were started on Feb. 18th and include improving the drainage on several cart path locations and work on the final 3 sand bunkers.

Pool repairs will start the 2nd week of March and be completed before the pool opens May 1st. We looked at tile samples and gave our input.

The intake cover for the irrigation pump for the golf course has been reworked and will be installed by a diver on February 23rd.

The final piece of missing fence between HHR and Wyndstone has been completed.

We signed a 5-year hosting contract with Go Daddy for our community HHRlifestyle.org website. This includes ensuring our website is secure.

Our 2019 taxes are at the CPA and will be completed and mailed soon.

The painting in the back room of the Pro Shop is complete. The new icemaker is installed and electrical has been run for the new freezer.

A title examination by our attorney should be completed by March 1st. This will verify we have free and clear titles to all HHR common ground and the golf course prior to the transition.

Charter will install internet in the maintenance building for Tammy to use and so we can install a security camera in that area. A security camera by the Pro Shop will be installed soon.

The location for a new street light on Hawks Landing Dr. near the entrance has been chosen.

The electrician will be working with Cuivre River to get it installed soon.

A Gantt chart was approved to be sent to the residents giving more details on the transition. It is now posted on the website.

Three bids were obtained for new gutters and downspouts at the clubhouse and a company was chosen. The work will be started as soon as they are available.

The lake dredging project is still being investigated. Thank you to John Shaal for sharing his vast knowledge in this area. Dredging quotes are expected to be submitted in the next few weeks.

A method for a more secretive election voting process was discussed and will be considered once we transition.

A company was chosen to update our Reserve Study.

The next meeting will be March 17th at 10:00am.




Are you on a Gluten Free diet? Do you have Celiac Disease? We have several HHR residents, who would like to get a group going to share information & support one another.

BLOSSOM—A Gardening Column by Ann Chandonnet Plants have so many uses. They can be beautiful, edible, perfumed, medicinal--or offer several applications. Fennel, for example, is delicious in sausage and also a favorite food of pollinators. Bergamot or Bee Balm is a member of the mint family; use it in tisanes as well as to attract bees, butterflies and humming-birds. Rosemary deters cabbage moths, bean beetles and carrot flies. You can also prune it like a topiary.

Butterflies have been called "music on the wing." If attracting butterflies is your goal, try milkweed, foxglove, and roses. To supply nectar to insects, grow asters, bee balm, black-eyed susans, purple coneflower, or butterfly bush.



To bring songbirds to your yard, plant bittersweet, beautyberry, viburnum and holly. Firethorn (pyracanttha) is now flourishing in HHR. It makes a nice, bright, accent bush.

If you plant Missouri natives, you'll discover they require less water and less fertilizer than cultivars. Sugar Creek Garden in Kirkwood is a source of over 2,000 varieties of plants.



For many years HHR has done fundraisers to purchase gift cards and food baskets for the soldiers that pass through Lambert Airport on their way home for the holidays. This past year, we gave out 75 gift cards, which is good. But, we can do better.

- 1. Approval of an Escrow agreement and acceptance of Plat One streets and stormwater systems in Creekside Landing which is along Technology Drive just east of the day care center. Several homes are under construction.
- 2. Approval of an Escrow agreement with SR Development guaranteeing completion of subdivision improvements for South Ridge Shoppes subdivision. This development is behind Aldi's.
- 3. Approval of several grant applications for Old Hwy N Intersection construction and Old Highway N reconstruction with MoDOT. These projects border the South Ridge Shoppes subdivision.
- 4. An urgent care facility will be constructed in the South Ridge Shoppes which will be the first structure in the development and the first urgent care facility within Lake Saint Louis city limits.
- 5. Several annexations, both voluntary and involuntary were approved.

Snow Removal Services

We have received numerous complaints regarding the snow removal vehicles driving too fast on the streets of HHR. The head of Lawn Authority (who has our snow contract) informed me that they have to keep the speed



up to keep the momentum of the truck going forward, when the snow is not very deep but it is very heavy because of the high consistency of sleet, water and slush involved. Also by going at a faster speed it takes and throws the snow out farther and leaves a thinner layer at the bottom of the driveway. When it is warmer and the snow is wet, it tends to snowball off of the plow kind a like if you were rolling a snowball for a snowman and it collects more at the end of driveways. When it is colder out and the snow is dryer this does not happen as much.


