## ADVISORY BOARD REPORT

We moved our meeting to an earlier date this month so we could make important decisions about the pool and golf course. The Chairman of our Board of Directors also joined us. It was decided to reopen the golf course to the public with the same restrictions in place of social distancing, 1 rider per cart, etc.

After much discussion the vote was to open the pool with very strict guidelines. It will be residents only with no pool furniture provided. You may bring your own chair. The County Health Department, which issues our pool permit, stresses the need to continue with social distancing and that residents should be responsible for sanitizing any HHR items they use and enter at your own risk. It will open as soon as the new pump arrives, is installed and the backflow valve is repaired by a licensed plumber. The restrooms in the clubhouse will be open but the rest of the clubhouse will remain closed.

The shuffleboard will be ready for use soon.

Maggie has some fun outdoor activities in the planning stages.

4 new street signs have been ordered and the others have had their posts painted.

As soon as irrigation repairs are made around the clubhouse, the waterfall and fountain in front of the clubhouse will be turned on. New landscaping at the waterfall was completed the day of our meeting.

A new light for the fountain behind the Pro Shop has been ordered.

Sidewalk repair is complete as well as sealing the cracks in the streets in Phase 2.

A meeting with our sound engineer will be May 18th about improvements to the sound system in the clubhouse.

The lake dredging is moving forward for late winter. A final estimate that includes an engineering study will arrive any day.

Transition from our current Board of Directors to an HOA Board of Directors will occur when the final home closes which is scheduled for August.

These are unprecedented times and we appreciate your understanding of the difficult decisions that are having to be made.

Our next meeting will be June 16th.

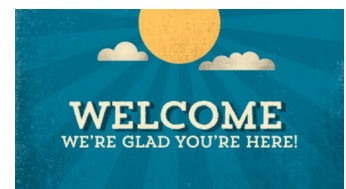

## COVID-19 ADJUSTMENTS for upcoming events

We are closely following advice from the CDC and health department regarding our upcoming events. Social distancing is required at all activities.

In order to accommodate more people the concerts listed below will all be held in the parking lot at the front of the clubhouse. This space will allow us to spread out and stay safe. It is imperative that all residents are respectful and abide by the guidelines below.

Both meetings in May were conducted on Zoom with public access available. During both these meetings the city budget for 2020-2021 was discussed in detail. The city budget year runs from July 1, 2020 thru June 30, 2021. At this time when we start the new budget year salaries have been frozen and no part time employees have been retained to date. Most employees are working remotely from home except of course the Police and Public Works. Park programs have been suspended except for maintenance. One bright spot is that the youth baseball program with adjacent cities is resuming. The construction of the new urgent care facility behind Aldi which is part of the South Ridge Shoppes development continues.

Our new budget will be very austere until we know better how the business economy and city sales tax recovers. Many projects are on hold until we have a better feel for what our revenue picture will be.

Construction projects both roadwise and private developments continue with construction permits still at a high level. As many of you know more and more businesses have reopened and I encourage all to support the small businesses within the city. Some new development and businesses we expect to start soon and when more definitive information and times are available, I will communicate that to you.

## HHR Resident Father's Day Scramble

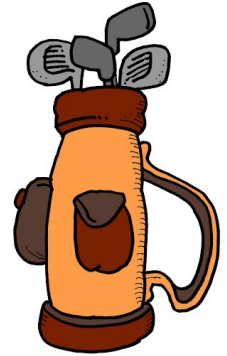
