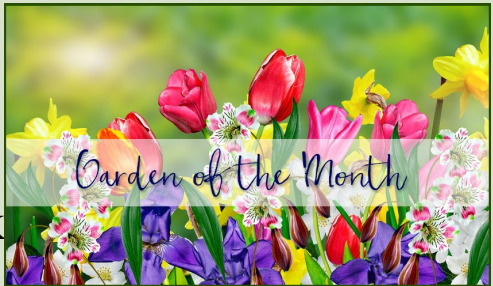

## Resident Spotlight

### Deb & Mike Rine

For Deb and Mike Rine, the focus at HHR has always been on people looking after one another. With the onset of the Coronavirus that sentiment has grown exponentially.



“Being a good neighbor is so important,” said Deb. “The virus has provided an opportunity for people to do things for others that they might not otherwise have done.”

Deb has been part of Care and Concern for a while, focusing on preparing casseroles for residents who are sick or have been hospitalized. While her “crew” of four has made and frozen about 25 casseroles, she plans to increase her helping staff to eight, preparing meals in her home kitchen as need dictates.

Their offerings, in addition to casseroles, include soups and cookies. A fundraiser held before the shutdown helped to purchase containers and ingredients.





“People can call me if they know of someone in need,” Deb said. “We keep track of meals that have been delivered and when we run low we will meet and prepare more.”

Mike says he, too, has noted many changes since the shutdown began. “It’s similar to the shift that happened during World War II – people did different jobs, electronics changed and the focus shifted.”

Whereas the Rines were very involved in social activities before Covid – cards, Friday Night Scramble, Putting Obstacle Course, water aerobics – they decided to stay safe, stay home and communicate electronically till things fully open up again. The Rines have been married for 49 years, have two daughters and three “grand dogs.” They look back on successful careers – Mike as a systems data analyst for the Department of Defense; Deb as a disability specialist for railroad workers and currently a tax preparer. Before the shutdown Deb was also active in her church’s handbell choir. “But, for now, everything is on hold,” Mike said. “It’s difficult not to do things; it wears you down. I’m looking forward to a resumption of normal activities again.”

## **Advisor Report**

**June 2, 2020**

It was decided to clean and put out the pool furniture.

Complaints about the conversation pit at the pool being slick were discussed. It was decided to make sure residents know it is not an entrance or exit for the pool.

It was decided to put out an email encouraging residents to power wash their houses due to mold.

A new pump has been installed for the pool.

Additional oyster shells had been put on the bocce ball courts.

The Pro Shop dumpster enclosure was repaired and repainted.

A new light kit was installed in the fountain behind the Pro Shop.

The clubhouse will now allow billiards, library use, line dance and 2 people in the exercise room.

The sound system upgrade was approved.

**June 23, 2020**

The Reserve Study was explained to us by Kris Kern of Asset Guardians and Doug Gardner CEO of DNI.

The May Financials were discussed and approved to be posted on the website along with the golf course

May financial report. We received \$900 from Lombardo Homes for street repairs on Myna.

The Out & About club is donating \$500 to be used for new vinyl tablecloths or the sound system for the clubhouse.

It was decided to reopen the clubhouse on July 6th for small meetings, ping pong, cards, etc.

No large groups or guests will be allowed in the clubhouse, the pool or any outdoor event.

The clubhouse will return to 3 times a week cleaning.

Movie rental will be available at times to be determined times.

Permits and details about dredging the lake are moving forward.

Approval was made on a proposal to construct a silt fence on the farm land to the south of HHR to prevent additional silt debris from entering the lake this year. The proposal also includes work to clean out the growth and silt in the creek behind Myna Drive.

Some new street and stop signs will be installed the week of the 23rd.

Kelly will investigate invasive plants around the retention pond on Falconcrest.

There is a lot of rotting wood around the outside of the Pro Shop that will have to be addressed soon.

A new street light on Hawks Landing Drive inside the entrance should be installed by Cuivre River hopefully within a couple of weeks.

Kelly is working on repairs to the west pool gate entry keypad.

Our next meeting is scheduled for July 14th at 10:00am and our attorney will be present to talk about the transition.

1. In person Board of Aldermen meetings resume on July 6 as well as City Hall being open.
2. Freymuth Lane construction continues and I hope it will be completed by the end of July.
3. Clementines Cremery should be open in the Meadows in July as well as Mattinglys Sports Bar in the Shoppes of Hawk Ridge.
4. During our most recent Board meeting the Mayor reread a resolution passed several years ago supporting our local police. I encourage all our residents to show their support for our police by putting blue ribbons on mail boxes or other prominent items on your property.
5. Board approved Preliminary Subdivision Plat, Final Subdivision Plat, Site Plant & Special Use Permit for Purpose Wrecker at 1744 Prospect Road. The tract is divided into 3 tracts, one for expansion of their equipment storage yard, one for residential (no proposed development) and the third for a business park (no proposed development).
6. Approved the city budget for July 1, 2020 thru June 30, 2021.
7. Approved naming no- name park of 35 acres to Deer Ridge Park.

Due to the Global Pandemic our Heritage of Hawk Ridge Golf Course has adopted guidance from state and local health officials. Their goal; to keep everyone healthy so we can enjoy the fellowship golf brings to our community.
