CityBeat By: Gary Turner, Resident of HHR and Alderman, Ward I For the second meeting in a row, a high quality Apartment complex was presented. The developer is the Mills Company; one of their developments is adjacent to the arena parkway and Hemsath Road. Their proposed development would be located on the southwest corner of Henke, Technology Drive, and Feise Road. This development would back up to the MoDOT right of way along Hwy 364 (Page). It will include a large clubhouse and pool. There will be no subsidized housing, similar to the development presented at the last meeting which will be behind Imo's, Walgreens, and First State Bank, backing up to I-64. Hopefully, both of these developments will be underway sometime this summer.

Also during the work session the Board directed staff to prepare an ordinance to restore previously withheld funds for city departments due the anticipated reduction in sales tax revenues due to Covid, which did not occur. In fact sales tax revenues increased over what was originally budgeted, primarily due to increased sales at Schnucks, Aldi, Lowes, and Walmart. Other businesses are recovering such as Von Maur.

The Dierbergs building structure continues to be constructed.

In other Board business, the following was approved:

1. A contract with Landscape Structures, for services related to the removal of existing structures and the purchase and installation of new playground equipment for the Lake Saint Louis Parks department. Specifically Boulevard Park playground equipment will be replaced. If you go to the city website the artist renderings should be posted. Will be up to date equipment for several age groups.

2. Repealed and replaced LSL Municipal Code dealing with land use and zoning. This bill included zoning of the parcel on the corner of Hawks Ridge Circle and LSL Blvd to Commercial Office (CO). This was the parcel that a developer proposed for a gas station. This CO zoning will preclude such a project.

Our police chief once again reminded everyone to lock their cars and do not leave valuables or any items of interest to thieves in their vehicles. This is our biggest crime problem in our community.
