#### <u>Resident Spotlight</u> Dennis Kruse

He knew early in life what he wanted to do, which presented him with both a goal and a path. He kept his eye on the prize and off he went

We're talking about Dennis Kruse and his only goal was to be a coach – the kind of coach who would serve as a role model and teach kids

not only to master the game of basketball but also to instill in them the work ethic, the importance of being both a better player and a better person. Ultimately that earned him a place in three Halls of Fame, including the Missouri Basketball Hall of Fame.

Dennis grew up, one of seven, in Hermann, Mo., always enjoying sports with his older brothers. He knew he wanted to be a basketball coach, which would require both an education and scholarships, which he got in both basketball and baseball. He graduated from Quincy University and later earned a Master's Degree in school administration. He taught classes in Physical Education, Biology, Drivers Ed, Marketing and more, all the while coaching multiple teams. Among his greatest achievements was leading the basketball team at his former high school, St. George in Hermann, Missouri, to the state championship in 1969. He also hosted and coached Belgian high school students as part of an enrichment program.

When Dennis' wife of 24 years passed away three years ago, he decided he needed to downsize and live in a community where he could meet people and get involved. In spite of the pandemic, he has managed to do that, making friends as he has played both golf and tennis. He still gives basketball lessons.

"I've been fortunate in having a career that kept me 'out of work' all my life," he said. "For me this was never a 'job'; it was always what I wanted to do."

1. Approved renewal of a contract with Gerstner Electric for maintenance of city traffic signals.

2. Approved an escrow agreement with McBride Duello, LLC, providing continued maintenance of streets and storm sewers to be dedicated to the City in the Wyndstone Plat Three Subdivision.

3. Approved acceptance of the streets and sewers in the Wynstone Plat Three Subdivision.

4. Approved a contract with Gershenson Construction for services related to the Lake Saint Louis Founders and Blvd Park Asphalt Improvement projects.

5. Approved several resolutions authorizing city officials to submit grant applications to the St. Charles County Road Board dealing with transportation improvement projects.

# BLOSSOM—A Gardening Column by resident, Ann Chandonnet

Unlike Gaul, your residential property is divided into two parts: hardscape and landscape. The landscape is the "soft" stuff--readily changed. This includes lawn, shrubs, flower beds, flower pots, flags, lighting, artistic house numbers, etc.

The landscape includes a narrow strip of lawn separating sidewalk from street. This is "The Devil's Strip," so called from the difficulty of watering it and endering it attractive. A century and a half ago, suburbs installed strips 6 to 8 feet wide and planted trees therein. The shade was welcome, but eventually tree roots muscled through the sidewalks!

The hardscape is the rest: porches, concrete terrasses, stone borders and pathways, the mail box, and the green boxes of various shapes and sizes that hold connections to services such as cable TV.

My grandmother would call these green boxes "unsightly." And some HHR residents share

that feeling. Trees and shrubs have been planted close around these assemblages. as camouflage.

All well and good, except: Before the rains came, there were stickers on these boxes telling you not to plant anything within 10 feet on one side. I am not telling you to rip out this particular landscaping, but be aware that a serviceman may come at any time and remove your aesthetic improvements.
