Poet T.S. Eliot thought April was "the cruelest month." I must disagree: because April is the month for gardening catalogs. Here are several which offer unusual items:

1) **Kinsman Company** (<u>www.kinsmangarden.com</u>): Cascade planters, three-tiered planters, in hand-welded steel, coated in black plastic. A trellis to cover your downspout. Hand sanitizer (antibacterial and aromatic) from Kew Gardens. A "saddle bag" for the hip that carries pruners, phone, water bottle, music and keys. What has you up this early?"* "I'm going golfing," Gary Turner smiles pulling out a bag of clubs behind him like an old friend. It's April 22<sup>nd</sup>. The day after installation of the new city board of aldermen. And <u>that</u> is how Gary started his retirement. Out for a round of golf with a friend. Well played sir, well played. Exactly how one should start retirement. Golfing.

We hope you enjoyed your game. And we humbly thank you for serving this city and community so well.

The City of Lake St Louis swore in a new Mayor as well as 4 new Aldermen in the month of May. Currently, the work flow is standard items thus allowing to break the new kids in grace-fully as we work to become a cohesive team. We all look to support what is in the best interest of the Lake St. Louis.

We have 3 items of note this month:

- The city is in discussions to obtain an easement of land along the church property, creating a walking path that will help connect the new Deer Ridge Park to Hawk Ridge Park (Zachary's playground). Talks are going well and the full hope is, at some point, to interconnect all parks including Quail Ridge.
- McBride made a conceptual presentation to the City of O'Fallon for a new subdivision. This 910 unit plan to be called the "Harvest" subdivision, would be located at the southwest corner of LSL at Hopewell & Highway N. A benefit to our city would be an increase in the retail corridor near the new Dierbergs, Lowe's and Wal-Mart bringing in higher tax revenue. A negative impact would be an expected increase in traffic. A second, more in depth presentation, is expected in July or August.
- The city is gathering details from two different vendors to install license plate readers bringing us in line with O'Fallon & Wentzville who have had good success with them already. Each company offers a positive aspect and we expect to untimely have a mix of both styles. Adding in grant money that is expected, LSL will soon have a total of 17 cameras.

**Golf Cart Etiquette:** In order to keep our golf course in great condition, let's remember to follow these rules when using golf carts on the golf course.

- Golf carts should remain on the cart path at all times.
- Please keep all four tires on the cart path when parking the golf cart at the tee, at the green and on curves. There should be no reason to be off the golf path when you park.
- Don't pull off the cart path. If you park to the far left, most passing carts can stay on the path.
- If it is needed, let the passing cart leave the path in an area that is not already worn or muddy.
