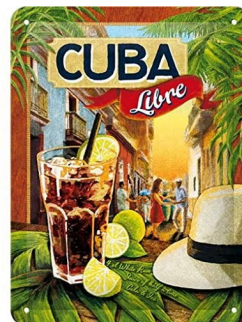

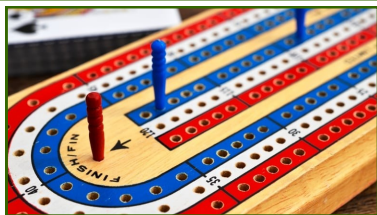


## Hawkettes Pom Squad Meeting

## GOOD TO KNOW

### BLOSSOM—

#### A Gardening Column by resident, Ann Chandonnet

Deadheading is a practice that takes very little effort yet delivers good results. It is removing spent flowerheads. This removes from the plant portions of stem and flower that no longer need feeding.



When deadheading Prairie Coneflowers, take the spent flower in your left hand. With your gaze, follow the stem down 6 inches or so until you see a tiny bud nestled between the stem and a leaf. This is a future flower. Now cut off the spent flower about one inch above this bud.

The same thing goes for tall white daisies. However, the bud can be really small and more than 6 inches down. So it looks like a tiny natural pearl.

Lawn report: Typically the lawn crews applied big leaf killer everywhere except a narrow rim around the edge. This year, however, they are doing much better, and there is scarcely a dandelion to see. Nut sedge is also under almost complete control. Hooray!



#### Adding one – Losing one.

Aventura at Hawk Ridge: A proposed multi-unit development located at 6770 Lake Saint Louis Boulevard (southeast corner of Lake Saint Louis Boulevard and Hawk Ridge Trail) is in the pre-application stage. Construction of the 144 luxury multifamily units spread over 5 three story buildings along with a clubhouse, pool, fitness center, pocket park and a resident only dog park is being reviewed. More information to follow as it becomes available.

Meadows Apartments project by Imo's has been paused due to market conditions and financial considerations. The approval is good for one year should the builder wish to pursue the project.

The City's Tree Board is discussing adding signs in Deer Ridge Park where you can scan a QR Code right from your smart phone to learn more about selected trees and plants. The QR would connect you with Morton Arboretum in Lisle, IL or to our own Botanical Garden here in St. Louis. This would add a nice learning element to the trails.
