Alice Malzahn

Alice was born after the Great Depression and, since her parents felt they could not afford to keep her, they put her up for adoption. It was only after her adoptive mother passed away that Alice was given a purse with all her adoption papers. Upon checking them out she learned that her father and mother were still married and she had one brother



and four sisters who never knew she existed. What a surprise to them!

Alice married her high school sweetheart, Wayne, a loving Christian, who played football as a tackle at the University of Colorado. They started dating at 15 and married at 20. They were married for 56 years before he died. They have three children, 10 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. Alice and Wayne worked with youth groups, did weekends for Christian Marriage Ministry and were Sunday School teachers, involved with Bible Study Fellowship and went on several mission trips overseas.

Alice worked for Jackman's Fabrics for 17 years, making several trips to New York to buy fabric and was General Manager for three stores. She worked for Precious Moments Chapel as Sam Butcher's assistant and planned events there. In Centralia, she helped start Community Bible Study and worked for Coldwell Banker. Today she belongs to First Baptist Church in Lake St. Louis and will be leading a study in Spiritual Gifts this fall. She has traveled to Europe, South America, Central America, Canada, Iceland, Israel and more than 60 countries.

Advisor Report

August 4 & 25, 2020

All Advisors were in attendance at the meeting on the 4th and John Shaal was unable to attend on the 25th. Doug Nance, the chairman of our Board of Directors attended on the 25th.

The monthly financial report was approved by email and has been posted on the HHRlifestyle.org website.

The removal of dead trees due to ash bore disease will be removed the week of Aug. 31st. Tammy has already removed some of the smaller ones.

The sign company will be looking at 4 stop signs that are blocked from view due to owners' trees. If the tree can't be trimmed to allow visibility a move of the sign will be considered. Insulation of the Pro Shop ceiling will occur in October.

Kelly is receiving bids on the necessary work on the outside of the Pro Shop building.

The problem with a clogged sewer behind a home on Myna will be addressed by the daycare bordering the property.

The retention pond fountain will again be fixed this week.

The annual Wentzville fire inspection of the clubhouse/Pro Shop were completed on July 2nd. Estimates will be received on the necessary street repair for next year.

There was lengthy discussion on items to be included in the 2021 Budget. This has to be finalized by November.

The handicap ramp in the parking lot has been painted.

Thank you to Tim McCullen for repairing the landscape lighting at the entrance and to Trish McCullen for the flowers in the pots near the entrance.

The HHRlifestyle directory problems have been solved. It was definitely not Larian's fault. He spent countless hours on the phone with the server getting the problem solved.

Lombardo Homes will be giving us a \$15,000 check to help with the lake dredging cost. The next meeting will be September 15th at 9:30.

More Neighborhood News

BLOSSOMS

A gardening column by Ann Chandonnet

A few summer recommendations for your landscaping:

- 1) If we have several days of rain in a row, shut off your irrigation system. This will prevent your lawn from getting mushy.
- 2) The gorgeous "mop heads" of white hydrangeas tend to soak up water like sponges. They will take some time to dry out, and meanwhile the branching system is becoming bent. To avoid this problem, find a grandchild who still thinks a dollar bill is a treasure and have the heads gently shaken out, one by one.
- 3) High winds took down sections of several large trees in the subdivision. Baby your tree. No longer is it considered necessary to paint hot tar on the raw wood. But weed a circle 6-feet across around the tree. Then pour on a bag of mulch. Remember to water this damaged tree during dry spells in winter, and it should be fine next year. Next April, be sure to give the damaged tree several fertilizer stakes. (These can be found at Lowe's.)
- 4) If your yard has broken tree branches that need to be removed, leave a little "collar" where the branch meets the trunk. In other words, do not make your cut flush with the trunk. This method has proven healthier than the old one.
- 5) Some mature trees are now encountering the branches of other trees in the yards of the older HHR homes. It is best to have an arborist deal with this matter. An arborist will be able to use ladders or cherry picker buckets to shape the trees attractively. It is not a good idea to just hack!

To avoid this problem if your house is new and you're setting out small trees, be sure to check the distance information on the tag that comes with the tree. Or check with the gardening center where you purchase it. Ten feet from trunk to trunk is usually minimal. Again, check also the width expected. When digging allow for this future width.


