Resident Spotlight

Rosemary Reid

Lebanon, Damascus, Bahrain. Whereas, for most of us, these are places we hear about on the news or read about in novels, for Rosemary Reid they are places where she has lived, worked and reared a family.



Born near Stratford-on-Avon in England, Rosemary joined the British Diplomatic Service and worked in the British Embassies as a personal assistant. She married a Dutchman, a military man, who took her to Middle Eastern countries where he was stationed. She saw the Dead Sea and the Gaza Strip but, during the 6-Day War in the Middle East, wives were evacuated and sent to Rome.

Rosemary's husband was later posted to NATO in Belgium, where she represented Holland on an International Wives' Club committee; there were lots of social events. Her son Alex was born during this time and later attended boarding school in England.

Her next "adventure" took Rosemary to Spain where, ultimately, she lived for 30 years and worked at a bank. Her parents purchased a beautiful Mediterranean-style home in Spain that they eventually gave to her.

After Alex came to the U.S. and married a girl from Wentzville, he encouraged his mother to follow so she could be near him and his family. Three years ago, she learned of HHR, purchased a home and had her furniture shipped. Today that home is a living testimony to collectibles from around the globe.

Rosemary loves spending time with her grandchildren, now ages 9 to 14; also the family "granddog" and is always ready to babysit. She enjoys her HHR friends — playing Hand and Foot and Cribbage; going to Bible study, swimming in the pool and taking Out-and-About trips.

"But once a year I go back to Spain for five weeks to be with friends," she said. "I love it here but Spain will always be special to me."



Trees. Trees are valuable additions to your landscape. Each mature tree is said to add \$5000 value to your property.

I don't think HHR residents are taking my advice to heart. Some have had old trees cut down, and then flooded the replacement with water from a hose. Wrong!. New perennials and trees need to be kept moist during their first



year. In 2021, we have had high temps, often over 90 degrees; the rain storms we have had are insufficient for new growth. If there are a couple of dry days, get out there with an iced tea pitcher of H2O and water your tree! This takes but a minute, and you can train a grandchild to do this chore. The second important point concerns mulch. Mulch is beneficial. Rain seeping through it creates fertilizer for the tree.

However, the placement of mulch is critical. If mounded right around the trunk, this encourages insects to attack both bark and cambium (growth layer). Instead, shape the mulch like a volcano, with none touching the bark right down to the ground. Otherwise you will see cracking bark, perhaps death of one side of your precious investment, insect invasion--and a very unhappy tree.


City Beat by Resident & Alderman Jackie Schauer

(Not all stores will have the same opening date.)

Aventura at Hawk Ridge. A new apartment complex was approved at the last board meeting at the southeast corner of Lake St Louis Blvd and Hawk Ridge Trail. The site plan shows 5 multifamily buildings, and 144 unit's total as well as a clubhouse and a retention area for storm water. They developer will also be donating 2 acres of land to the city as part of this project for future use of the parks department and a trail connecting Deer Ridge Park and Zachary's playground.



Our Official Census Data is in: the city grew by 2,162 for an offi-

cial population total of 16,707. As the deviation between wards is less than 10%, no change in ward maps is expected.

All of the new license plate readers have been installed, (mainly at the entrances/exits of the expressways) keeping the city safer and connecting us with surrounding towns for heightened monitoring.

Two new police offices have been hired and a third is scheduled to join the city in November and another in December.

For those who travel west on Freymuth Lane, the area owned by MODOT is scheduled for repairs anytime now.

The state's conservation department approved our request for a grant for improvements at Deer Ridge Park. This project target for the glade area (backing up to Falconcrest cul-du-sac) will take a few years to complete. Stage 1 will consist of 3 sprayings to kill the weed/vegetation currently there; this fall, once in the spring and again in summer. It is not expected to "look pretty" during this stage. Once completed, the city will begin to plant new items next fall and again in the spring of 2023.

15 new trees were planted throughout the city this Arbor Day.
