Dave & Sharon Phillips

"Ball 4, Strike 3." How often did Dave Phillips make such proclamations during his 32-year career as an umpire?

It was a career that Phillips and his wife, Sharon, could never have imagined when they began their married life in 1964, three years after graduating from Jennings High School.



But perhaps it was destiny that began Dave's career. Short on cash as a teenager he cut grass, delivered newspapers, worked in a gas station and played baseball. When umpires were in short supply for little league games and he realized that, at age 14, he could make a whopping \$5 per game he jumped at the opportunity.

Ultimately, he loved it, so after he and Sharon married, Dave went to Umpire School, got a job with the Minor Leagues and seven years later was promoted to the Major Leagues as one of the youngest MLB umpires in history. Dave umpired for 32 years and was selected to umpire several World Series; he wrote a book, "Center Field on Fire" about his many memories but he says the 1982 World Series when the Cardinals played Milwaukee was one of his many highlights. He has a great collection of memorabilia displayed in their beautiful HHR home.

Sharon worked as a secretary before their three children were born, then handled everything on the home front during Dave's long stretches out of town. She reared their three children, managed their home, paid bills and taxes and did everything the two would have done together.

The Phillips three children (Kim, Jill and Randy) loved going to three weeks of spring training, making friends with the children of other baseball umpires. Today their kids have blessed them with 7 grandchildren, one more on the way.

The Phillips moved several times during his career. They previously had lived in Lake St. Louis, both on the small lake and, later, the big one. "So, moving to HHR from Whitmoor Country Club was like coming home," Sharon said. "People here have been friendly and warm. We're really looking forward to meeting more people and welcoming them into our home."

PLEASE READ

- -For your safety, we highly recommend that you swim with a buddy at the pool. Swimming alone can be dangerous if there is any kind of incident or medical emergency. Remember there is no pool phone, so always bring a cell phone.
- -Slow down and watch out for children, bikes and walkers on the streets.
- -HHR Age Restriction per the Covenants "No Owner may lease or sell a Unit unless at least 1 person who will occupy the unit is 55 years of

age or older." Meaning, when you go to sell your home, at least one of the new residents must be 55 or older. If you are using a realtor to list your home, please make sure that they are aware of this requirement as well. Also note that any permanent occupant (meaning they reside at your home in HHR for more than 8 weeks) must be at least 18 years of age.
