The same form is used for both types of projects, and when doing multiple projects at the same time you only need to submit once. Forms and instructions are available on the website and in the clubhouse.

Marsha Kipp

It wouldn't take much imagination to picture Marsha Kipp as a store model, wearing a beautiful hand-painted silk Chinese gown and handing out samples of luxury fragrances such as "La Baiser du Dragon," at a Giorgio Armani store. Still lovely at age 80, she started out modeling shoes, then progressed to other modeling positions at Issey Miyaki, Donna Karan and, finally, at Cartier. She held several of these positions, primarily in the northwest, while her husband, David, worked as director of training at Chrysler. She loved the ocean and small towns and, when it was time to move, she always found jobs and other activities to fill her life. "I loved my jobs but, mainly, I enjoyed being a good wife."



As she thought back to these jobs, she added with a shy grin, "People said such nice things to me, such as 'When I come into the store and see you, I know it's going to be a good day.'" And it was in some of the small towns out West where she started painting and sculpting. Much of her artwork is displayed in her home including bristlecone pine pieces that she has carefully preserved with oils to prevent decay.

But for all the kudos she received in her jobs, she notes, emphatically, that her greatest accomplishment was rearing two children – their son, Matthew, who is a pharmacist, living in Vancouver with his wife, and daughter Corinne who lives nearby, works with horses and connects with her every day.

The Kipp's last residence was in New Mexico but, after David's passing and burial at Jefferson Barracks, she was happy to return to this area, where she grew up. She moved to HHR 14 years ago. She has enjoyed being part of this active community ever since. She had a "significant other" named Paul for three years but, sadly, he too passed away two years ago. They had enjoyed traveling. Their favorite destinations were Germany and England, also San Antonio, the Blue Ridge Mountains and Nashville.

Sometimes we have to keep starting over, she acknowledged, then laughed and added a quote from Leonard Cohen, "There is a crack in everything. That's how the light gets in."

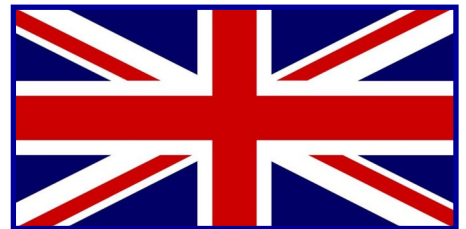

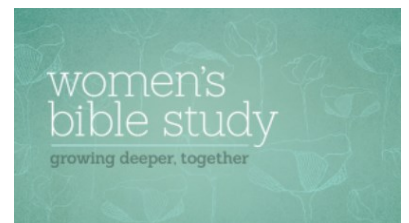

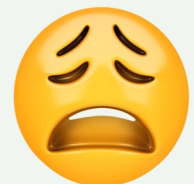
