RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT By: Joan Elliott

Ann and Fernand Chandonnet

From the time they met as teenagers until today, as octogenarians, Ann and Fernand Chandonnet have never lost their sense of curiosity. Their desire to explore and always be learning something new was clearly in their DNA, which then translated into writing, editing and photographing the world around them.

The two, both English majors, met at Lowell State College in Massachusetts and eloped in their 20s. Ann taught at Lowell State while Fernand went into the



Army. They lived in California for four years, then spent 33 years in Alaska, primarily writing and editing.

During a long and storied career, Ann wrote two cookbooks, four food histories, a travel guide to Alaska, four children's books and a history of the Civil War, based on family correspondence, a copy of which is in the HHR library. She even covered a murder trial once that lasted more than two years, in which she helped uncover some crucial evidence. "I call that my greatest accomplishment," she said.

Fernand worked with a conference of scholars on a book about "Alaska during World War II." It was a collection of essays, some of which he wrote but most that he just edited. "That was a long project," he said, "and, after that, I never wanted to edit anything again!"

Fernand sometimes took photographs to accompany Ann's books and, while living in North Carolina, built an authentic log cabin on their property. "It was a 'learn as you go' project," he said, and laughed.

The Chandonnets have two married sons, one with two daughters, living five minutes away; the other with one daughter, living in Costa Rica. "Raising them was my greatest joy," Ann said. "They're both very successful men."

Ann and Fernand think of themselves as "private people," so they haven't participated in many activities at HHR. Fernand, however, can be seen daily walking the neighborhood with Rosie, their dog, while Ann sometimes enjoys the pool during the summer.

Before bed they read out loud to each other, taking 30-minute turns. "We share each other's passions," Fernand said, "always looking for the true meaning of things."

HHR Whiskey Club

I moved to Tennessee from the St. Louis area about 7 years ago and found out that whiskey was a favorite topic of conversation in pretty much any social setting. Until that time, my knowledge and understanding of the world of whiskey was limited to a few well-known brands. To learn more about bourbon whiskey and whiskey in general, I went on a journey to the Kentucky Bourbon Trail in 2017 along with a friend of mine. It was on the Bourbon Trail journey that the idea of starting a whiskey club at the over 55 community in which I lived was born. My friend and I felt we could have some fun with a little different approach by focusing more on the educational and tasting aspects while still maintaining some of the social fun.

We put together our ideas and started the process of forming a whiskey club. The intent was to offer tastings of a variety of whiskeys at each meeting while providing a discussion of the distilling process, the distillery, the history, the tasting profile, etc. of each whiskey. Our agendas have included several great topics, such as Bourbon Whiskey, Rye Whiskey, Scotch Whisky, Irish Whiskey, and Canadian Whiskey. We also had meetings where members chose a whiskey to present. The club was a huge success, starting with 40 plus members in 2019 to over 120 members in 2023. My wife and I moved back to be closer to family and I wanted to start a similar club here at HHR.

An informational meeting was held on November 9, 2023, to discuss starting up a Whiskey Club here at HHR. Based on that meeting and some follow-up emails, there is enough interest to start up this club. It is open to all residents and their guests. The club will meet on the third Thursday of each month at 7pm in the clubhouse ballroom, beginning in March 2024. Typically, 4-5 whiskeys will be tasted (3/4-ounce pours) with a knowledgeable presenter discussing information about each whiskey being tasted. Tastings will be \$10 per person. Guests of residents can attend as well. There will also most likely be an annual \$5-10 membership dues to cover the establishment of the club and general supplies. And stay tuned for more information about this new club. It is going to be a fun and informative group. Where else will you be able to taste 4 or more whiskeys for \$10. If you are on the fence about joining the club, give the club a try without an obligation to join. We are about whiskey education, sampling and tasting something new, and member socialization. And without spending a lot of money to try something new. You get to better understand what you like, and what you do not like. Feel free to suggest your neighbors and friends to check out the club.
