Gary and Diane, native St. Louisans who recently celebrated 40 years of marriage, have smiles on their faces when they talk about their big family, which includes 5 children, their spouses, and 7 grandchildren. "Nana and Papa" have 3 more grandbabies on the way (in the next 3 months)!

After their youngest child began college, Gary and Diane set out on a new adventure together. They got the bug for "life on the water" after a chartered catamaran vacation with friends. Before they knew it, the two of them, Gary as the pilot, and Diane as the navigator, were out on the open water on their own 43 ft long range, live-aboard motor yacht. Diane describes a vivid memory: their first time crossing into the Bahamas with their two adult children vacationing on board, where they were greeted by the dolphins playfully leaping around the boat.
