Resident Spotlight by Deb Lindell

Ira & Helen Kaplan

To be welcomed into the Kaplan home and to hear their story is to be invited into the joy of 34 years of shared adventures and cherished memories.

Ira's story began in Baltimore, where he grew up and earned a degree in logistics. Helen, in contrast, grew up in Kansas City, earning degrees in education, at Mizzou, and then Michigan State. During his career, Ira worked for several manufacturing companies, but primarily Olin Chemicals and Vlasic Pickles. It is while both were working for Vlasic that Ira and Helen met and married and their shared story begins. Helen says that wherever Ira worked, he rose to the top. Ira attributes his success to a comment made by his first boss at Olin, who was asked, "Does Ira work for you?" "No," he said, "Ira works WITH me!" Ira adopted that attitude as his own with everyone, everywhere he worked.

The Kaplan story is a multifaceted story. It is a story of hard work, and also perseverance, as both are cancer survivors. Their story is also the story of adventure and new beginnings. They have traveled to South America, Russia and all over Europe, and to Moorea, an island in French Polynesia. In 1997, because of their love of the southwest, they moved to a mountain home near Albuquerque NM. There, both became long term substitute teachers. And they loved it! However, their greatest adventure was to be part of a hot air balloon team for 10 years. During the International Balloon Festival, 1000 hot air balloons are launched daily for 10 days. The Kaplans, fully participated—serving breakfast, flying in the balloons, etc.

Following their New Mexico adventures, the Kaplans completely retired—to an active adult retirement community near Tampa FL. They loved it there-as Ira says they have loved every home they have lived in, but in 2023 made the decision to move closer to family. They had visited Helen's sister, Jane McFarland, here at HHR several times, and in September of 2023 when the right home became available, they became HHR residents. As you can imagine, they love it!

JENS CORNER— Clubhouse update:

The short story is the sprinkler system in the clubhouse sprung another leak.

The long story is that the alarm went off, and we were able to reset it because the compressor in the fire room was on and keeping the system charged properly. The alarm went off a second time, so we assumed it was a sensor fault and scheduled a service call with the alarm company. Then, the compressor died, and the leak became apparent.

In the interim, the Fire Marshal granted permission for us to open the building. Until repairs are made, staff is on "fire watch" and we are required to inspect the building every 30 minutes while open. During these inspections, the cleaning company's lackluster performance became apparent, so we hired a new one. We anticipate a noticeable improvement when they begin cleaning the clubhouse in April.

City Updates from Jackie Schauer, Resident & Alderman

Route N - MODOT

The Route N conceptual design process is currently in progress, with preliminary design completion anticipated by December 2025. This work is the next step towards designing the improvements.

On Tuesday, March 4, MoDOT and St. Charles County will host a public meeting from 4-7 PM at the National Equestrian Center. At the meeting, attendees will review conceptual layouts, review the Hopewell/Duello intersection signalization, learn about the project's progress and timeline, and provide input on proposed designs and improvements.

Planning and Zoning is meeting next Thursday (3/6)

• Special Use Permit and Minor Site Plan for a new 160-foot monopole telecommunication tower on the archdiocese property north of the cemetery.

Rezoning and Major Preliminary Plat for a new 15-lot single-family subdivision at 8770 Orf Road. Paragon Custom Homes is proposing R3 zoning (9,000 sq. ft. lot minimums) though the layout features lots ranging from 11,000 sq. ft. to over 28,000 sq. ft.

The Zamboni garage is vertical; block was laid last week. Still needs a roof. The underground utilities for the skate shop were piped in and concrete was poured. The playground structure appears almost complete.


Whiskey Club
