Resident Spotlight: Jerry & Renee Lambert

Some Scoop



Now that fall is upon us, many of us are winterizing and cleaning up our yards. As a reminder, the HHR Rules and Regulations have the following guidance when **removing trees/plants from your property** as well as the common areas.

Section F.3, Common Area states the following:

Removal of trees or plants from common grounds is strictly prohibited without ARC approval. Wetland/conservation areas may not be disturbed in any way.

Section F.7, Landscape Changes states the following:

Trees shall not be removed from any resident's property without prior written approval of the ARC. In some cases you may need to submit an Architectural Change Request at the clubhouse for approval.

Holiday Luminaries 12/24—12/26

For the past 20+ years, HHR residents have had beautiful luminaries in their front yards and on the common grounds on Christmas Eve. This year the luminaries will be used both Christmas Eve & Christmas Night. The candles are available at the HHR clubhouse M-F 9-1pm for \$1 each. This is the one time we take cash. To be consistent, we use electric luminary candles only. The new candles have been tested and have stayed lit for over 1 month. But, we ask that you bring them in on 12/26. You can likely use the batteries again next year. Homeowners set out luminaries on Christmas Eve, December 24 and bring them in on December 26. The luminaries are placed next to the street in front of the home, approximately 15-20 feet apart. Executive homes put out 3 to 4 luminaries and villa homes put out 1 to 2 luminaries depending on the size of the lot. Each homeowner places their luminaries around 4:30 pm on Christmas Eve. Our container is a gallon milk jug or gallon water jug. Start saving your milk/water jugs or have someone save them for you. If you have extra jugs, please clean them and leave them in the foyer of the clubhouse for a neighbor to use. For residents who are unable to obtain one-gallon jugs or to cut them, there will be some available at the clubhouse. If you are not home on 12/24, please try to make arrangements with a neighbor to put out your luminaries.

You will have to put 1" sand/gravel/or kitty litter in the bottom of the jug to hold the jug and candle in place. There is a sample at the clubhouse office.
