Resident spotlight – By Stacy Flint

### Gayle O'Neill

Born and raised in St. Louis, sports have been a defining thread throughout Gayle O'Neill's life. With the St. Louis Cardinals in her DNA, she learned the game from her dad and has been keeping score on a scorecard at games since just three years old. When they weren't at a game, they were at her grandmother's home off Grand Avenue, listening to the game from Sportsman's Park through the open windows.



Gayle played sports her entire life, including softball from grade school through college, and later spent 15 years on an over-50 traveling softball team. She met her soon-to-be husband, Terry, on her 21st birthday, on a volleyball court, while reffing his game and fielding his attempted argument over a call. She knew he was the one when he was the only person who could beat her in every athletic competition they tried. They created a loving, Irish Catholic family with their three children. Gayle cherishes time with her five grandchildren, especially cheering them on from the stands of games.

Gayle combined her 30-year career as an educator (PE) with her love of the Redbirds when she was hired as a Cardinals tour guide 20 years ago. Based on a field trip curriculum she used with her students, she helped create the Cardinals Academic Program, now used for hundreds of student field trips each year and also adopted by other MLB parks. Today, she serves as a supervisor overseeing the program, museum, and tours (including co-leading tours with Bill DeWitt and Ozzie Smith). When she's not working, you'll find her at the games, in her strategically picked seat in Section 300, the game playing in her ear and scorebook in her hand.

From creating and publishing The St. Ann Scene newspaper out of her home in the 1980s while the kids were young to teaching to traveling and volunteering, Gayle has always been on the move. That's literally true on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 6:45 a.m., when she's leading the Ascension Grade School Run Club.

Whether she's behind the wheel of the MASH Jeep in the Fourth of July parade or at the Halloween party as Philadelphia Karen or Maleficent, Gayle says HHR "is what I didn't know I needed." From the home's thoughtful layout to Friday night golf and the welcoming community, she's happy to call HHR home for the past decade.



Monday, March 9, 2026


1:00 - 4:00 pm

In an ongoing effort to keep HHR Residents informed, this is a reminder of what is actually stated in the **HHR Rules and Regulations regarding Parking and Vehicles**:

#### Section G.1, Parking - Vehicles

For emergency vehicle access and the safety of our community, residents should park their vehicles in their garage or driveway. Exceptions are driveway sealing or other maintenance on the driveway.



No vehicle – including golf carts- may be parked within the property except on a paved parking surface, driveway or within a garage (golf carts may be parked at the rear of the home on a concrete pad per Section G.2). Residents or guests are not permitted to park vehicles on any unpaved or undeveloped property in the community and vehicles parked in violation of this policy may be towed at the owner's expense.

Boats, boat trailers, campers, travel trailers, mobile homes, recreational vehicles, and the like, and any vehicles not in operable condition and validly licensed, may be kept inside a garage and concealed from public view. With exception, RVs may be parked on the street for up to 48 hours for the purpose of loading/unloading and cleaning.

Garage doors are to be maintained and shall remain closed at all times except when necessary for ingress and egress. (Per Section G.4, No automobile or other vehicle repairs or like activity shall be conducted within the Properties other than in a garage and concealed from public view.)

Thank you in your efforts to continue to follow the HHR Rules and Regulations.

## Golf Committee 2026

The Golf Committee was formed to act as a liaison between the Heritage of Hawk Ridge (HHR) Residents, the Heritage of Hawk Ridge Community Association (HHRCA) Board of Directors and the Golf Course Management company.

The Golf Committee is comprised of HHR residents who are active members of the Hawk Ridge Golf Club. These voluntary positions generally span a two-year period with the committee's goal of making our course a fun and enjoyable experience. Meeting monthly, they look for ways to enhance our course, are active in helping plan/host tournaments, and aid the community as required.

A representative from the HHRCA Board of Directors, the HHR Community Director, and the Golf Course Manager also attend the meetings.

### **Specific requirements / duties include:**

- Each member is required to be a member of the Hawk Ridge Golf Club, and have a basic knowledge of golf course management.
- Each member is responsible to plan and host an HHR Tournament Event, attend monthly/scheduled meetings, and meet with Golf Course Management Company personnel as required.
- Review tournament or fundraising events, in conjunction with the Pro Shop, to ensure all details are being considered. A 'Golf Tournament Registration Form' may be required prior to scheduling a new event with our Pro Shop.
- Provide feedback and suggestions to the HHRCA Board of Directors regarding golf course and pro shop improvements to enhance the resident/player experience.

### **Structure** - The Committee will be comprised of nine members.

- The nine Committee members will consist of eight voting members (The Chairman and six resident members) and two non-voting members (The HHRCA Board of Directors Representative and HHR Community Director).
- A Committee member, designated as an Alternate if needed, may participate in all meetings and discussions however, will not have the ability to cast votes. Should an active member resign their position the Alternate would assume their role.
- New Committee members and the Chairman will generally have two-year terms with at least two members rotating off each year.
