Now that spring is getting near, many residents will be doing improvements or even considering selling their property. This being said, thought it might be time to review the applicable Rules and Regulations in Section F.11 which discusses signage that tends to appear this time every year.



Section F.11 -Signs states:

- Owners may display a "For Sale" or "For Rent" sign not to exceed 36" X 24".
- One security sign is allowed in front and back of a residence alerting that the residence has a security system. It should be no larger than 8 inches by 8 inches on a standard rod no taller than 30 inches.
- Contractor signs may not be displayed on any Lot or Common Area.
- No sign of any kind may be displayed in or on the Common Area without the prior written consent of the association. Board members are allowed to move or remove any signs not in compliance.
